**Question 10**

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Tasmanian National Parks and Wildlife have reported a significant increase in the number of tourists and visitors to its parks around Tasmania. A large number of development proposals have been put forward to attract more visitors to its parks and wilderness areas.

One such development has resulted in the Three-Capes Track, beginning at Port Arthur in Tasmania's South-East. This track is designed to be an achievable experience for a wide range of ages and bushwalking experiences. It was built to a dry-boot standard from a range of materials, including timber, stone and gravel and is about one-metre wide, wide enough for two people to walk side-by-side. In four days and three nights, walkers will cover the 46 kilometres, taking in tall eucalypt forests, coastal heath and Australia's highest sea cliffs. Evenings are spent in warm and comfortable environmentally-sensitive cabins, where mattresses, cooking pots and pans, and gas cookers are provided.

Describe how first time multi-day bushwalkers undertaking this type of walk may experience connection to the natural environment. (30 minutes)

### Question 11

For many years, the Tasmanian natural environment has been used for a variety of purposes, many of these for commercial profit such as mining, forestry, power generation, agriculture, aquaculture and tourism.

Media reports in Tasmania have consistently reported that people are developing a deeper connection and relationship to the natural places around them, and their local community. This has resulted in an increase in individual and community commitments to protecting natural places.

Describe the historical and contemporary issues that have influenced this change in values towards the natural environment in Tasmania. (30 minutes)

### Question 12

When people engage with the natural environment, they bring with them their own unique values, attitudes and cultural perspectives.

Discuss how an increased understanding of Aboriginal values and attitudes towards the natural environment contributes to your understanding, experience and relationship with nature. (30 minutes)

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
