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Question 9

Scenario:

You and two good friends, Isaac and Julia, are at the end of the first day of a four-day sea kayaking trip exploring a section of coastal Tasmania.

Isaac, a highly experienced paddler, capsized at the start of the day in calm conditions. As friends do, you and Julia have been laughing and joking about it ever since, but Isaac now feels upset and humiliated.

Now that you are at the campsite, Isaac has set up his tent quite a distance away from you and Julia. He refuses to talk or help with dinner.

Describe and justify a conflict management strategy that:

- (i) Could be effective in this situation.
- (ii) Would be **unlikely** to be effective in this situation. (13 minutes)

Question 10

The Overland Track and the Three Capes Track are two of Tasmania's iconic multi-day bushwalking trails. These trails are subject to highly structured booking systems, and require walkers to pay a fee in addition to the National Park Entry fee.

Including fees, food, transport and equipment, it would not be unusual for small groups and families to spend thousands of dollars on an experience on one of these bush walks.

In a carefully constructed extended response (essay form), discuss the potential implications of applying user fees on human-nature experiences, and the influence this might have on personal values towards the natural environment. In your response, choose **TWO** different user groups and/or stakeholders that might be affected through a fee-paying system. (60 minutes)

Question 11

You are the leader of a small group of youths who are about to embark on their first ever multi-day bush walk. They are from a major Tasmanian city and have not spent much time in wilderness areas before. You have issued them with the appropriate food and equipment. They are quiet and clearly nervous.

Peter Martin has argued that outdoor experiences should promote critical reflection on the relationships that people have with nature.

In a carefully constructed extended response (essay form), describe and analyse some factors which you believe may contribute to the way this group of youths may be feeling towards this bush walk. Discuss your understanding of Martin's *Signposts to Nature* (2004) framework. In your response, describe and justify at least **TWO** activities a leader could implement to increase connections to the natural environment. (60 minutes)

Question 12

Connection to country is fundamental to the identity of many indigenous Australians. Many school-based outdoor education programs seek to explore the historical and contemporary connections that indigenous Australians have with nature.

In a carefully constructed extended response (essay form), discuss how an increased understanding of Aboriginal culture through such education programs can contribute to a greater understanding of connection to country. In your response, describe and justify at least **TWO** activities that would foster a greater understanding of Aboriginal culture and connections to the natural environment. (60 minutes)

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
